- Hectic mornings are minimized when students know they can eat breakfast at school.




Student Cafeteria Accounts

CEP provides all students with a healthy breakfast and lunch every day at no charge, regardless of household's income and without an application. No further action is required of the parent and/or guardian. This program will allow all students to receive school meals free of charge.

Wellness

The LPPS Child Nutrition Department works closely with supervisors, administrators, and schools to provide a school healthy school environment for all students. Through nutrition education, special events, and continued innovation, we are reaching our goal to provide high quality, nutritious meals in a customer friendly environment that supports all students' ability to achieve academic excellence at school while forming healthy eating habits that will last a lifetime.

Livingston Parish Public Schools enacted a local wellness policy in accordance with the state and federal laws. As required by the Louisiana legislature, the district has appointed a School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) compromised of a representative from each of our 43 schools.

Wellness assessments are administered a minimum of every three years to review policy compliance, assess progress, and determine areas in need of improvement. As part of that assessment, a review of each school's activities and practices related to healthy eating, nutrition education, and physical activity are reviewed and evaluated using the Louisiana Department of Education *Well Policy Evaluation* tool. As necessary, the School Board, SHAC representatives and/or individual schools within the District shall revise the Wellness Policy and/or wellness practices to improve health and wellness efforts.
